PLEASE NOTE

Competition in this List of Premiums is restricted to Members of the Society, except for Dogs and Home Produce. Light Horse Exhibitors have a Day Membership included in their class entry fee.

All stock must be the bona fide property of, and have been in the actual possession of, the Exhibitor before 1st April in the current year.

Prize money will be paid on the day, on production of the prize card awarded in the ring. Exhibitors should collect any prize money before 5pm from the Secretary's marquee on the main showfield, NOT from the Light Horse Secretary's tent.

All Regulations should be read before any entry form is completed and signed. Light Horse Exhibitors should be aware of both applicable Livestock Regulations, published in the Livestock Schedule, Catalogue and on the Website, as well as the Regulations contained within this specific Light Horse Schedule.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. Judging times will vary depending on sections and rings. Please see the Horse & Pony timetable for approximate times. Sections being judged simultaneously will not be delayed under any circumstances.
2. The Committee reserves the right to alter the times and format of classes, or to cancel any class, at its sole discretion.
3. The Society shall not be liable for any loss or damage which may arise from injury to any exhibit, either during the Show or during transit. It is strongly recommended that all exhibitors have their own third-party insurance cover.
4. The Committee shall decide all questions respecting Premiums and other matters connected with the Show, and their decision given verbally by their Convenor, shall be final and not subject to any review whatever.
5. Stock for special or extra prizes is subject to the same Rules and Conditions as for any other prizes, excepting in this, that where Special Conditions are annexed to a special or extra prize, such special conditions shall prevail over the ordinary Rules and Regulations.
6. Every Lot must be intimated by a Certificate of Entry, together with the correct Entry Fee, and lodged with the Entries Secretary by the date shown on the front of this leaflet, or in accordance with Late Entries / Entries on the Day as indicated. Printed forms of entry to be had on application to the Secretary, or online through the show website www.westfifeshow.com.
7. All exhibits shall during the Show be in the charge of Exhibitors themselves, or Servants, and shall be placed in the Showground according to the directions of the Committee.
8. The decision of the Judges shall be final and not subject to review on any grounds whatever.
9. A protest can only be lodged on either or both of the following grounds;
 - i) That the exhibitor is not qualified to compete, or
 - ii) That the exhibitor is excluded by the Conditions or Rules of Competition.
10. Every protest must be made in writing and must be delivered during the Show at the Secretary's Office in the Showground. A deposit of £50 must be lodged with each protest and the Committee shall have power to withhold repayment if any expense has been incurred, or if they consider the protest unnecessary, or trivial.
11. On the second Tuesday after the Show, the parties to a protest must be in attendance at the Office of the Secretary of the Society at 7.30 pm with such evidence as to them may seem proper, when the protest will be disposed of by the Committee, whose decisions given verbally by their Convenor, shall be final, and not subject to any review whatever.
12. In the event of a Prize being awarded to an exhibit, against which it or its exhibitor a

protest has been lodged and sustained, as provided in Rules 9, 10 and 11, such prize shall be forfeited and shall be due to the exhibit (if any) which the Judges shall have found to be next in order of merit.

13. In no case shall a Premium be awarded unless the Judges shall deem the exhibit of sufficient merit.
14. All Horses and Ponies must be haltered and led.
15. The ages of all animals must be reckoned from 1st January in the year of birth, except where otherwise stated.
16. NO substitute entries will be accepted in Light Horse classes.
17. Ponies MUST NOT be left unattended tied to trailers/horse boxes.
18. A Riding Hat which complies with, or exceeds, the current standard must be worn at all times by mounted riders within the Showground.
19. It is mandatory for all horses and ponies entering the Showground to be vaccinated against **Equine Influenza**, except foals under 6 months. All vaccinations must have been administered at least 7 days before the date of the show.
All animals must have completed the primary course of two vaccinations. If enough time has elapsed, the 3rd booster vaccination must have been administered. Please seek veterinary advice on the timing of vaccinations. **Further booster vaccinations must be administered at intervals of not more than 365 days.**
Random passport checks may be implemented and any animal without a current, valid vaccination protocol, or an owner / rider unable to produce a valid passport, will lead to immediate eviction from the Showground.
20. By signing the entry form, exhibitors accept that we will share their data, if necessary, with the bodies and breed societies listed in the schedule. Data will be published in our Show Catalogue, may be on the Society's website, and given to the local press with regards to the Show's results. The Society will maintain a database, reviewed annually, solely for the purpose of mailing Exhibitors and Members. Exhibitors do have the right to withdraw consent of this at any time by contacting the Secretary, secretary@westfifeshow.com.
21. Exhibitor tickets to access the show will be emailed to the address provided. Please ensure that your email address is entered clearly and correctly on the entry form, or online entry system. **Tickets can pre-purchased for £10 online or can be purchased on the day at the gate for £12.** Tickets will be allocated on the basis of two tickets for the first animal entered and one further ticket for an additional animal. The maximum number of tickets issued per exhibitor will be three. Additional tickets are available to purchase online at the time of entry. **All children (under 14 on the day of the show) will be free.**

NPS SCOTLAND QUALIFIERS – RULES 2026

To be run under NPS SCOTLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES 2026. These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the Rules of the National Pony Society. Copies of these rules can be found on our website www.npsscotland.co.uk

Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

A judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Qualification if he/she feels that the pony is not of a sufficient standard.

NPS Scotland/Townhead Pet n Pony In Hand Mountain & Moorland Championship.

In Hand M&M Championships: The Champion & Res. Champion in all Mixed pure-bred M & M or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualification may go to 3rd in the Championship (i.e. 1st Reserve Champion)

Classes 434 & 435, 436 - 439, 443 - 446, 447 & 448, 449 – 451.

NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies, not already qualified, in each class will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.** This can be either mixed M. & M. or Breed Classes

Classes 456 – 457.

NPS Scotland/Harbro Open Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championship.

NPS Scotland/ The Achilty Stud Open In-hand Riding Pony/Hunter Pony Championship

The two highest placed pony, in each open in-hand Riding Pony or Hunter Pony Class (foal classes excluded) not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. **Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place**

SHETLAND PONY STUD BOOK SOCIETY Affiliation Rules 2026

1. **Classes must be confined to SPSBS Registered Ponies.** Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.
2. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.
3. ***TO ENTER A STALLION IN ANY CLASS (IN-HAND OR PERFORMANCE) AT AN AFFILIATED SHOW, ENTIRE MALES AGED 4 YEARS OLD AND OVER MUST HAVE AN 'S' NUMBER AND HAVE SUCCESSFULLY PASSED EITHER THE SPS-BS STALLION ASSESSMENT PRIOR TO 2006, OR THE CURRENT SPS-BS VOLUNTARY VETERINARY EXAMINATION. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In Hand entire males 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of 2 years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a Colt or Stallion bridle badge, these can be purchased from the SPS-BS.***
4. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats conforming to current British safety standards must be worn, correctly secured by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In- hand classes. For health and safety purposes judges and exhibitors must remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. Hard hats conforming to current British safety standards must be worn, correctly secured by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. ***Ridden and driven ponies must be four years old or over.*** In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

HIGHLAND PONY SOCIETY

All ponies must be registered in the full body of the Highland Pony Society Stud Book (including Appendices A, B and C). All competing Highland Pony stallions in affiliated shows (In Hand, Ridden and WHP) aged 4 years and over, should be **licensed** with the Highland Pony Society.

Youngstock Championships 2026

- This show is a qualifier for the 2026 Highland Pony Society Youngstock Championships.
- The Champion youngster across classes 443 and 444 will qualify for the Highland Pony Youngstock Championships. If already qualified, the card will pass to the second placed pony but no further.
- Only pure bred registered Highland youngstock; foals, 1, 2 and 3yrs olds may enter.
- Two Championships will be held; one in Scotland and one in England. The qualifying exhibitor can select which Championship Show they wish to enter.
- Exhibitors are not required to be members of the Highland Pony Society for qualifying classes. However, all those competing in the Championships must be members of the Society.
- Entry to the Championships is free.
- At the Youngstock Championships, the Champions and Reserves will receive rosettes and prize money of £100 and £50 respectively and all those forward at the finals will receive £15 and a finalist rosette. A sash and perpetual trophy will be awarded to each of the Champions.

BSPS Scotland Training Stakes Championship Qualifier

The final will be held at the BSPS Scotland Finale Show on Saturday 12th September. Competitors can qualify at affiliated shows throughout the summer and the Final will be open to both members and non-members.

*****You do not need to be a member of BSPS to enter these classes. Both the qualifying classes and the final are open to everyone*****

Qualification: The two top placings will qualify but must jump clear. Qualification can pass down to 4th place as long as the combination has been clear. If a combination qualifies in all three height sections they will only be able to jump the two higher heights at the final.

60cm BSPS Scotland Training Stakes – Plaited or Heritage Mountain & Moorland ponies, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 158cm. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. Maximum height of fences 60cm

70cm BSPS Scotland Training Stakes – Plaited or Heritage Mountain & Moorland ponies, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 158cm. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. Maximum height of fences 70cm

80cm BSPS Scotland Training Stakes – Plaited or Heritage Mountain & Moorland ponies, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 158cm. Riders any age but must be suitably mounted for the pony/horse they ride. Maximum height of fences 80cm

This Show is Affiliated to the British Show Pony Society and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in the B.S.P.S. Classes, whether or not Members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Constitution and Rules of the B.S.P.S., including disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S.

Blair Castle BSPS Training Stakes Series: Ponies placed first & second in the 60cm, 70cm and 80cm training stakes classes will qualify for the Championships held at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials & Country Fair on Thursday 27th August 2026. Qualification may go down to fourth place if higher placed ponies have previously qualified – only those who have jumped a clear round can qualify.

HATS

43. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.

BODY PROTECTORS

50. *Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes, Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade*

Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.

Air Jackets may be worn. If a member chooses to wear an air jacket they are allowed in addition to a normal body protector, which meets BETA 2018 level 3 standard. Air jackets must not be worn under any jacket or body protector and numbers must be fitted with elasticated fastenings .

When an air jacket inflates the sudden noise can startle horses, thereby, causing difficulties for other members if used in confined areas, eg, indoor schools and ménage's. Therefore, air jackets are not encouraged to be used in those areas except for medical reasons.

SPURS

51. The wearing of spurs in ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules is forbidden. Spurs or dummy spurs must not be used when working in.

WHIPS

52. In ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules whips are not to exceed 75cms (30ins). Hunting Crops are permissible. This includes whips/sticks used by leaders in lead rein classes. Padded whips are recommended for WHP classes. A whip, if carried, must be held in the hand by the handle with the handle at the top.

At all times the whip must be used; For a good reason, as an aid to encourage the horse/pony forward. At an appropriate time, namely when the horse/pony is reluctant to go forward with the normal aids of seat and legs. In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg. Never over arm. With appropriate severity. No more than twice for any incident. Riders must not hit a horse/pony before the start of a jumping course.

Excessive use of a whip anywhere on a showground will result in disqualification of the horse and rider from any classes entered on that day.

This includes, but not limited to;

Use of the whip to vent a competitor's anger is always excessive.

Use of the whip which causes injury, e.g. broken skin or weal is always excessive.

Use after elimination or retirement is always excessive.

Use on the horse/pony's head and neck is always excessive.

Using a whip from the ground after a fall or dismount is always excessive.

If the rider's arm comes above the shoulder when using the whip this is always excessive.

From 2026, in WHP and WSP classes riders must only use a baton whip.

Training Stakes

METHOD OF JUDGING: Animals will be required to jump a course of fences and will immediately be asked to give a short show, including a change of rein, in the same ring.

MARKS:	Jumping	60
	Style and Manners while jumping	20
	Show Mark and Manners	20
	TOTAL MARKS	100

Rules: 1. **Animals may be entered in a maximum of two classes in this section and they must be consecutive.**

2. Animals will enter the ring individually.

3. Fall of Horse / pony or rider will result in elimination.

4. There will be no mark awarded for conformation.

5. Any suitable tack and turnout.

6. In the event of a tie, the Style and Manners mark will determine the final placing.

BRITISH HORSE SOCIETY

Perth Equine Vets / BHS SCOTLAND WORKING HUNTER

Maximum height of jumps - 3ft 6ins; maximum spread - 3ft 9ins. Class 402 is a qualifier. The first **three** qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified the qualifying card can be passed down to 4th place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear. To be eligible for the final, to be held in August 2026 at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials and Country Fair, the rider of the horse must be a member of the BHS.

This competition is run under Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB (GB) the governing body of all hunter and sports horse's classes). It is the responsibility of organisers and competitors to be familiar with these rules; they can be found at www.sporthorsegb.co.uk
Please be aware of rule number 51 H which states: All ridden hunters must be shod all round. No pads or surgical shoes are allowed.

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

H&C Racehorses

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but may be asked to gallop in your individual show.

Qualifying shows are open to members and non-members.

In order to qualify for the HCR Championship Show at Netherton Equestrian, Perth on 5th /6th September 2026:• HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place)• Non-members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge if placed 1st-4th(6th)), fees and register with HCR before the entries close for the HCR Championship show'
