All Associate Members are entitled to attend the Annual General Meeting of the Society. This will take place on Monday 2nd November 2026 at The Board Room, Collier Quarrying, Goathill Quarry, Easter Bucklyvie, Cowdenbeath, KY4 8ES at 7.30 pm.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. **SUBSCRIPTIONS are payable at the point of entry.** Members who have not yet paid their £10.00 subscriptions are requested to do so to the Society.
2. All annual subscriptions and entry money must be paid to the Society **before Show Day**. Exhibits by anyone failing to make payment as above are disqualified from competition, and any prize which the Judges may award to such exhibits will be withheld and be due to the exhibit which the Judges may find next in order of merit.
3. Competition in this List of Premiums is restricted to members of the society, **except** for DOGS, AND HOME PRODUCE. Crop competition is confined to Members of the Society in the Central and West Fife District. Entries for the crop sections are restricted to crops grown on land owned or tenanted by a farmer holding a Department of Agriculture code number. They must be in respect to whole fields or a minimum of eight acres (three acres in respect to forage).
4. Stock from any holding under any disease restriction should not be entered. All Cattle (including calves) must come from a negative herd status for BVD, from a herd that is fully accredited free of BVD, or they must be individually tested free of the virus (antigen)
5. Cattle will only be accepted from herds that are not restricted by the Brucellosis or TB orders. It is the responsibility of all owners to ensure that all TB testing and standstill rules are complied with. You should check with your local APHA office before bringing cattle to the show.
6. MAEDI VISNA - only fully accredited and non-designated sheep can compete. Separate stalls for both will be available. Strict conditions apply to accredited sheep on return from the Show, and details thereof may be obtained from Signet Farm Business, PO Box 604, Milton Keynes. SCRAPIE - all females of all breeds entered/exhibited should be empty, not have lambed within 30 days before the Show, and not be subject to procedures that change the seasonal breeding pattern.
7. Judging times will vary depending on sections and rings: 9 am for Clydesdales, sheep, and cattle, and 10 am for goats and poultry. Sections being judged simultaneously will not be delayed under any circumstances.
8. PARADE OF PRIZE STOCK - all prize cattle and horses in halter will be paraded at the Show. Any refusal to parade will be reported to the Committee and the prize money withheld.
9. The Society shall not be liable for any loss or damage that may arise from injury to any exhibit during the Show or during transit.
10. The Committee shall decide on all questions respecting Premiums and other matters connected with the Show. Their decision, given verbally by their Convenor, shall be final and not subject to any review whatsoever.
11. Stock for special or extra prizes is subject to the same rules and conditions as for any other prizes, except that where Special Conditions are annexed to a special or extra prize, such special conditions shall prevail over the ordinary rules and regulations.
12. Every Lot must be intimated by a Certificate of Entry, together with the correct entry fee, and lodged with the Livestock Secretary by the date shown on the front of this booklet. Printed entry forms are available from the Secretary or online through the show website www.westfifeshow.com.
13. Every lot must be on the Showground no later than 8.00 am on the day of the Show and penned (where pens are provided) and should not be removed before 4.30 pm or at the Chief Stewards' discretion.
14. All exhibits shall, during the Show, be in the charge of exhibitors themselves, or servants, and shall be placed in the Showground according to the directions of the Committee.
15. The Premiums awarded will be paid on Show Day to all exhibitors who have paraded their stock where applicable (except crops). **NO** exceptions will be made.
16. No one will be admitted within the rings or pens while exhibits are being judged except where the Judges or committee members may be in attendance upon them.
17. The Judges' decision shall be final and not subject to review on any grounds.
18. A protest can only be lodged on either or both of the following grounds.
 - i) That the exhibitor is not qualified to compete, or
 - ii) That the exhibitor is excluded by the conditions or rules of competition.
19. Every protest must be in writing and delivered during the Show at the Secretary's Tent in the Showground. A deposit of £25 must be lodged with each protest, and the Committee shall have the power to withhold repayment if any expense has been incurred or if they consider the protest unnecessary or trivial.
20. On the second Tuesday after the Show, the parties to a protest must meet at the Office of the Secretary at 7.30 pm with evidence of the protest. The Committee will consider this, and its decisions shall be final and not subject to any review.
21. In the event of a prize being awarded to an exhibit, against which or its exhibitor a protest has been lodged and sustained, as provided in Rules 17, 18, and 19 such prize shall be forfeited and be due to the exhibit (if any) next in order of merit.

22. In no case shall a Premium be awarded unless the Judges deem the exhibit sufficient merit.
23. All pedigree stock must be entered in their respective herd books, or the exhibitor must produce a certificate from the Society's council stating that his animal is eligible to be entered therein. Stud book numbers for registered sections must be on the entry forms.
24. Breeding stock must not be shown in an improper state of fatness, and the Judges are hereby prohibited from awarding premiums to overfed animals.
25. All cows must have their calves within the year and, when exhibited, must either be in milk or calf. Those in milk must be milked during the time of the Show.
26. Bulls of one-year-old and upwards must be haltered and led.
27. The ages of all animals must be reckoned from 1st January in the year of birth, except where otherwise stated.
28. All cups and trophies are to be held by the winner for one year, except if otherwise stated, and are their responsibility during the year they have custody. They remain the property of Central & West Fife Agricultural Society. They must be returned **polished** and in good condition by Show Day the following year or to the Secretary or any Committee member.
29. The Show reserves the right to alter the times and format of classes or to cancel classes at its sole discretion.
30. By signing the entry form, exhibitors accept that we will share their data with the bodies and breed societies listed in the schedule, if necessary. Data will be published in our show catalogue, may be on the Society's website, and given to the local press regarding the Show's results. The Society will maintain a database, reviewed annually, solely to mail exhibitors and members. Exhibitors do have the right to withdraw consent to this at any time by contacting the Secretary, 07500 896340 or secretary@westfifeshow.com
31. **Cars accompanying horse boxes and wishing to park with them in the designated Horse Park will be charged £10.00**
32. **Buggies will not be allowed in and around livestock – under any circumstances - while Judging is ongoing.**
33. Forfeiture of entry fees:
Should any class/competition be cancelled because of bad weather or any other reason, 50% entry fees will be returned where a claim is made within four weeks after the show date. No other charges can be refunded

- In the event of the junior driver getting into difficulty, the experienced drivers must take the reins immediately and, when safe to do so, request permission from the Steward to leave the ring.
- Horses must be aged four years and over.
- Stallions are not permitted in junior-driven classes.

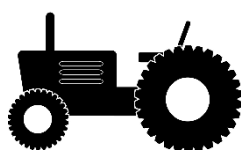
